Object:

To play all of your dominoes.

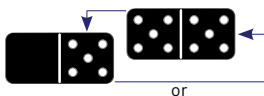
Preparing to play:

Spread the dominoes out face down on the table, mix them up and distribute them between the players. With two players, each receives seven dominoes; with three or four players, six dominoes. The rest of the dominoes are left to one side and constitute the draw pile.

How to play:

The game proceeds in a clockwise direction around the table. Whoever has the highest double plays first and places it in the middle of the table. (Note: If no one has a double, the youngest player starts).

The next player must then play a domino which has the same number of points as the double at one end. E.g. If the first double played is 5-5, the next player must play a 5-x domino and place the 5 end next to one of the two ends of the first domino.



Then it is the next player's turn to add a domino to the chain, respecting the same rule: you have to place end to end two dominoes whose touching ends are identical.

For example, if there are a 3 and a 2 at the ends of the domino chain, the next player must play a domino with a 3 or a 2 at one end.



If on your turn, you do not have an appropriate domino, you draw one from the pile and miss your turn.

Winning:

You win by being the first to play all of your dominoes. It is possible that the game may become blocked if none of the players can play any dominoes. In that case, the player with the fewest points on his remaining dominoes wins.
